The event was hosted by the Irish Historical and Literary Society. Fast forward to the last couple of years and Robert and I developed a close working relationship since I assumed the role of UICC President back in December 2020.

During his time here in San Francisco, Robert has shown great support of all we are doing on a regular basis as a hub for the Irish American community and has wholeheartedly supported our aspirational dreams for the new Center. Robert has graciously advised the UICC on applications for grants for cul-

tural programming and capital grant support for the 2025 Project. Robert has been very busy at the downtown Irish Consulate's Office during the last few years having overseen a major relocation and refurbishment of the Irish government's new hub at One Post Street, which now includes the Consulate, Enterprise Ireland and Tourism Ireland.

I want to extend my thanks to him on behalf of the entire UICC community for all he has done for us in the recent past. Robert and his family return to Ireland this August, and we wish him all the best in his diplomatic career.
