Bold Vision For The Irish Realized, San Francisco City Council Approves Plans For New Center

N SATURDAY, DECEMBER 16, 2023, on the sidewalk in front of the United Irish Cultural Center (UICC) against a bright backdrop of blue skies and sunshine, friends, neighbors, benefactors, and members gathered—spilling out onto 45th Avenue—to witness a significant milestone. At a special signing ceremony, San Francisco Mayor London Breed made official what the San Francisco Board of Supervisors unanimously passed earlier that week—building plan approval for the reimagined new Irish Center.

UICC Board President Liam Reidy told the assembled crowd that day: "We are building for the next generation of Irish Americans, building on and preserving the legacy of those Irish and Irish American community members who came before, and continuing to foster community for the benefit of all."

As the first Irish social center in the United States built entirely by volunteer labor and community contributions, the UICC has continued the work of its predecessors (such as the Knights of the Red Branch) in promoting and preserving Irish culture in the City by the Bay. Since the UICC opened its doors in the early 1970s, it has been a welcoming space for Irish visitors and immigrants as well as community groups and a variety of organizations.

Members and leadership of the UICC today are just as committed as their ancestors were to creating a vibrant and welcoming space for everyone interested in Irish and Irish American history and culture, as well as a place to foster community by nurturing, engaging, and inspiring all who cross our threshold.

With six stories above ground and two subterranean levels for parking and an aquatics center, the re-imagined Irish Center boasts a spacious lobby that will welcome visitors to experience a host of activities.

"The re-imagined facilities will better accommodate our growing cultural programming calendar as well as offerings of many youth and community activities," continued Reidy. "From Irish Dance and music classes and summer camps to blood drives and voting stations, the new Center will be a beacon in the community. The Center will feature multi-use

event space, pubs and fine food offerings, a gym, theater, and office and meeting spaces. We want to exemplify the best of both the future and the past," said Reidy, "sharing our history and traditions and continuing to build relationships with all of the cultures in San Francisco with whom the Irish have been partnering since the 1800s."

The heartbeat of the Center will be its extensive library, museum, and digital gallery with educational resources, interactive exhibits, and scholarly research available to everyone.

"Our celebrated Patrick J Dowling Library is bursting at the seams, and new exhibitions and cultural preservation efforts such as the popular 'Keepers of the Steps' (Irish dance history/ archive) require proper display space and room to grow. In addition, state-of-the-art performance spaces will ensure we continue to attract top talent from Ireland, abroad, and other places near and far, allowing us to deliver a wide range of programs to keep members and guests engaged and entertained," Reidy shared, adding:

"It has been nearly two years since we submitted our initial documents, and we are proud to announce that we are now on track to bring this dream to life with an actual building, not just a concept. Over the past year, we encountered several challenges, but thanks to the unwavering support of our community, we are moving forward and paving the way for construction. With the ongoing support of our membership and our Project 2025 supporters; San Francisco Mayor London Breed and the San Francisco Board of Supervisors, especially Supervisors Joel Engardio and Myrna Melgar, who brought the project forward; Irish Consulate Micheál Smith and his team, as well as the Irish Government, we are on course and building momentum."

The enthusiasm is palpable as the real work of making this dream a reality begins. "Let us join hands and hearts in this remarkable journey to keep our culture alive and thriving. Together, we can create a lasting legacy that will inspire and unite our community for years to come," urged Reidy. "It's a great time for the Irish of the Bay Area to celebrate our history and our future."

City Greenlights Construction Of A New Irish Center

nevolent Association celebrated 140 years in 2023 while the Rebel Cork Ladies celebrated 110 years in existence.


